AIR Strike

FIRST Robotics Team #78, AIR Strike, participated in the 2013 BAE Systems Granite State regional this past weekend.

Approximately 20 students, 15 mentors and their families attended the competition, which was held on February 28th through March 2nd at the Verizon Wireless Arena in Manchester, New Hampshire.

Over the course of two days of qualifying, the team compiled a 6-4 record to finish ranked as the 14th seed out of 45 teams. AIR Strike was chosen as the second pick by the 8th seeded alliance. Their partners were team #2791, Shaker Robotics from Latham, New York, and team #3467, the Windham Windup, from Windham, New Hampshire. Their alliance was pitted against the 1st seeded alliance in the elimination round quarterfinal matches. Their alliance was unfortunately outmatched, losing both matches and getting knocked out of the

tournament by the eventual overall competition winners.

AIR Strike also competed at the Maine Regional in Lewiston, ME on April 4th through the 6th. They won the Chairman's Award, qualifying them for the FIRST Robotics World Championship in St. Louis MO, April 24-27, where they will compete against hundreds of teams from around the world.

This is just the start of the 2013 FIRST competition season for AIR Strike. Later in the spring AIR Strike will hope to compete at several area off-season events in addition to local outreach. For information on how to help AIR Strike get to St. Louis, visit www.air4h.org.



Finding Blue Moose

In November, team #5468, Finding Blue Moose, was 1 of only 3 FTC teams asked to go to FIRST headquarters in New Hampshire to film a new promotional video for FTC. Will.I.Am. was also in it and it was released worldwide in January.

The RI State Championship went well for the Finding Blue Moose Team and they were nominated for 2 awards. They then went up to the Vermont State Championship and won the Motivate Award there.

Finding Blue Moose Team has also been invited to the World Championship in St. Louis, MO which took place April 24-27. They were part of the Opening Ceremonies for FLL and they are very excited about it. This is the third time that they have gone to the World Championship. They have also signed up to volunteer at the 4-H booth there.

The RI 4-H Club Foundation will hold its annual golf tournament on June 8th at Laurel Lane Country Club.



Joe lived in Harmony, RI for 28 years before moving to Canterbury in 2006. He was a Master Craftsman for the Adams Printing Co. in Pawtucket for the past 10 years.
